



### **Scripture Reading**

Galatians 1:13-17; 2:11-21

1 13 You have heard, no doubt, of my earlier life in Judaism. I was violently persecuting the church of God and was trying to destroy it. 14 I advanced in Judaism beyond many among my people of the same age, for I was far more zealous for the traditions of my ancestors. 15 But when God, who had set me apart before I was born and called me through his grace, was pleased 16 to reveal his Son to me, so that I might proclaim him among the Gentiles, I did not confer with any human being, 17 nor did I go up to Jerusalem to those who were already apostles before me, but I went away at once into Arabia, and afterwards I returned to Damascus.

2 11 But when Cephas came to Antioch, I opposed him to his face, because he stood self-condemned; 12 for until certain people came from James, he used to eat with the Gentiles. But after they came, he drew back and kept himself separate for fear of the circumcision faction. 13 And the other Jews joined him in this hypocrisy, so that even Barnabas was led astray by their hypocrisy. 14 But when I saw that they were not acting consistently with the truth of the gospel, I said to Cephas before them all, "If you, though a Jew, live like a Gentile and not like a Jew, how can you compel the Gentiles to live like Jews?"

15 We ourselves are Jews by birth and not Gentile sinners; 16 yet we know

that a person is justified not by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ. And we have come to believe in Christ Jesus, so that we might be justified by faith in Christ, and not by doing the works of the law, because no one will be justified by the works of the law. 17 But if, in our effort to be justified in Christ, we ourselves have been found to be sinners, is Christ then a servant of sin? Certainly not! 18 But if I build up again the very things that I once tore down, then I demonstrate that I am a transgressor. 19 For through the law I died to the law, so that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; 20 and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. 21 I do not nullify the grace of God; for if justification comes through the law, then Christ died for nothing.







## "A Little Jazz Mass"

## By Bob Chilcott

A Little Jazz Mass was composed in 2004 by English composer Bob Chilcott. It was written for the massed choirs of the 2004 Crescent City Choral Festival in New Orleans. The works five movements include easy jazz feels, swinging rhythms, gentle rocking motions and end with the "Agnus Dei" in a bluesy feel. Accompanied by piano, bass, and percussion, the harmonies are close and tight.

Bob Chilcott (b. 1955) was a member of the King's Singers and had the fortune to work with George Shearing, Art Farmer, the WDR Big Band, and as an arranger for the BBC Radio Orchestra. Chilcott has written many works for children's choirs and SATB choirs, and arranged a number of spirituals of which many are set in a jazz idiom.

New Orleans, in the 1870's was a racially diverse city that included French, Spanish, African, Italian, German, and Irish. It was during this time that the European classical, folk and African/Caribbean musical elements began to merge with popular American forms. Jazz began to emerge encompassing ragtime, blues, spirituals, marches, and the popular songs of "Tin Pan Alley." The profound contributions of people of African heritage were reflected in this new and distinctly American music.
